# **PART A - GENERAL ADMINISTRATIVE PROVISIONS**

1. SPONSORING YACHT CLUBS: The following clubs will share equally in the sponsorship of this series.

Seattle Yacht Club (SYC) Sloop Tavern Yacht Club (STYC) Corinthian Yacht Club of Seattle (CYC) Shilshole Bay Yacht Club (SBYC)

- 2. INDIVIDUAL RACE MANAGEMENT: Each yacht club will manage its own race, issuing entry requirements, race notices, sailing instructions and providing trophies for the event. In addition, each club will determine class breaks and awards for each class. No change from normal race management procedure will be required.
- 3. SERIES EVENTS: Each of the sponsoring clubs has an open Jack and Jill event scheduled for 1990. The dates are as follows:

- 4. SERIES MANAGEMENT: Each of the sponsoring clubs will manage the series on a rotating basis. STYC will manage the 1990 series, SYC in 1991, SBYC in 1992 and CYC in 1993 etc. The club in charge of series management will pass the responsibility on to the next club for the following year by the end of November. Changes in series rules will be approved by all sponsoring clubs prior to the end of December 1990 to allow inclusion of the revised rules in 1991 Race Books.
- 5. INTER/INTRA CLUB COORDINATION: The following individuals will be responsible for coordination of the series between clubs and for providing the required communication within each respective organization for the 1990 season.

Thereafter, the managing club will coordinate with the other clubs to determine who the contact parties for that year will be.

- 6. INDIVIDUAL RACE RESULTS: Each sponsoring club will provide a list of race results for its respective event to the managing club within 1 week after the date of the event. Series results will be provided to SYC within two weeks after the last series race so appropriate arrangements can be made for trophies.
- 7. PUBLICITY AND PROMOTION: The managing club will provide a press release for local sailing magazines and for use by the participating yacht clubs. Each yacht club will announce this series in its respective newsletter. A press release will be issued by the managing club to the local yachting periodicals and sponsoring yacht clubs showing the final series standings.

### **PART B - SERIES RULES**

1. ELIGIBILITY: All series events are "Open" races. Any yacht with a current PHRF handicap and PIYA affiliated club membership may participate, subject to meeting each individual yacht club's entry requirements and payment of applicable entry fees.

Yachts competing in this series are restricted to one male and one female crewmember. Although this is not an entry requirement for SYC's Single/Doublehanded Championship, a yacht competing for PUGET SOUND JACK & JILL CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES awards must comply with the one male, one female crew requirement and enter under the Double Handed category in SYC's event.

- 2. PARTICIPATION: Participation in the series is automatic for any eligible yacht participating in any of the four designated events, However, a yacht must start in three of the four events in order to qualify for trophy consideration. There will be no throwouts.
- 3. YACHT CLUB DESIGNATION: In the event that a participating yacht belongs to more than one yacht club, the entrant must notify the club responsible for managing the series which club they are representing for the series prior to the first race entered. For 1990, contact Carol Pearl (STYC) at 783 6419.
- 4. SCORING FOR INDIVIDUAL RACES: A yacht's finishing position within each established division (either NFS or FS) in any series race will determine points earned toward the PUGET SOUND JACK & JILL CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES awards as follows:

5. SERIES DIVISIONS: The following Series Divisions, based on a yacht's FS rating, are established solely for the purpose of determining the overall PUGET SOUND JACK & JILL CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES awards. A yacht without a FS rating will be rated for purposes of series scoring as if they have a standard spinnaker. A yacht with an approved rating change during this series will be scored in the division that they would fall within for the first series race entered. These rating breaks are only for series scoring and do not affect rating breaks established by each club for its own event.

Division 1 105 or lower Division 2 106 to 170 Division 3 171 or higher

Based on experience, the number of divisions and corresponding rating breaks may be changed in future years with the intent of providing approximately equal numbers of yachts competing in each division.

- 6. AWARDS AND PRESENTATION: SYC will provide series trophies for presentation at it's Annual Awards Banquet. There will be a trophy in recognition of the yacht with the best overall score in each of the <u>Series Divisions</u>. In addition, there will be a perpetual trophy in recognition of the yacht club with best overall participation and performance for the series.
- 7. SERIES SCORING: The yacht in each of the Series Divisions with the highest point total after the last series race wins the trophy for best performance in that division for the series. There are no throwouts. Yachts tied on points for the series will be ranked by applying the following criteria in succession:
  - (1) The decision will favor the yacht most often scoring the highest point total per race than all others tied until each is ranked.
  - (2) If still tied, the decision will favor the yacht scoring the most points in any race, or of still tied in any two races, then three races, etc. until each is ranked.
  - (3) If still tied, the decision will favor the yacht scoring the most points in the final race, or if still tied, the next previous race, until each is ranked.
- 8. CLUB SCORING: This award is intended to encourage maximum participation by yachts from all clubs in all series events and to recognize the club with the most consistent overall participation and performance. Scoring for this perpetual trophy will be as follows:
  - (1) All qualifying yachts (starting three of the four series events) will be counted. Points earned by each yacht in each race will be summed. The club with the highest number of points earned by all yachts from that club will win the series club championship award.
  - (2) In the event of a tie on total points, the club with the most individual qualifying yachts participating in the series will win the award.

Seattle Yacht Club, Sloop Tavern Yacht Club, Corinthian Yacht Club of Seattle, and Shilshole Bay Yacht Club are pleased to announce a new series to recognize the best Jacks and Jills on Puget Sound. These races are all "Open" events starting in the Shilshole Bay area. Details can be obtained from any of the sponsoring yacht clubs. STYC will manage the inaugural series.

Other than meeting individual race entry requirements and registering for each event with the sponsoring club, there is no separate entry, deadline, or race fee for this series. All you have to do is participate in three of the four events to automatically qualify for series awards.

SYC will provide awards for the series winners in each of three series rating bands and a special award for the yacht club earning the most series points at its Annual Awards Banquet. Mark down the following dates!

These divisions are only for series scoring and do not affect rating breaks established by each club for its own event.

- (2) If still tied, the decision will favor the yacht scoring the most points in any race, or of still tied in any two races, then three races, etc. until each is ranked.
- (3) If still tied, the decision will favor the yacht scoring the most points in the final race, or if still tied, the next previous race, until each is ranked.

SCORING FOR INDIVIDUAL RACES: A yacht's finishing position within each established division (either NFS or FS) in any series race will determine points (rounded to the nearest tenth) earned towards series awards. The scoring formula is as follows:

SERIES DIVISIONS: The following <u>Series Divisions</u>, based on a yacht's FS rating, are established <u>solely</u> for the purpose of determining PUGET SOUND JACK & JILL CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES awards. A yacht without a FS rating will be rated for purposes of series scoring as if they have a standard spinnaker. A yacht with an approved rating change during this series will be scored in the division that they would fall within for the first series race entered. <u>These divisions are only for series scoring and do not affect rating breaks established by each club for its own event.</u>

Yachts tied on selective points for First Overall or Series Division honors (counting a throw out race) will be ranked by applying the following criteria in succession:

- (1) The decision will favor the yacht most often scoring the highest point total per race than all others tied until each is ranked for each yacht's best three races.
- (2) If still tied, the decision will favor the yacht scoring the most points in any race, or of still tied in any two races, then three races, and finally four races until each is ranked.
- (3) If still tied, the decision will favor the yacht scoring the most points in the final race, or if still tied, the next previous race, etc. and finally four races, until each is ranked.

**CLUB AWARD:** This award is intended to encourage maximum participation by yachts from all clubs in all series events and to recognize the club with the most consistent overall participation and performance. Scoring for this trophy will be as follows:

- (1) All qualifying yachts (starting three of the four series events) will be counted. Points earned by each yacht in each race will be summed. The club with the highest number of points earned by all yachts from that club will win the series club championship award.
- (2) In the event of a tie on total points, the club with the most individual qualifying yachts participating in the series will win the award.

SERIES AWARDS: SYC will present all trophies at their Annual Awards Banquet. There will be a keepsake trophy in recognition of the yacht with the highest point total for three races in each of the <u>Series Divisions</u> provided by the sponsoring yacht club. There will be a perpetual trophy for 1st overall provided by SBYC for the yacht with the most points scored in three series events. There will also be a perpetual trophy provided by SYC in recognition of the yacht club with the best overall participation and performance in the series.

Yachts tied on selective points for First Overall or Series Division honors (counting a throw out race) will be ranked by applying the following criteria in succession:

- The decision will favor the yacht most often scoring the highest point total per race than all others tied until each is ranked for each yacht's best three races.
- If still tied, the decision will favor the yacht scoring the most points in any race, or of still tied in any two races, then three races, and finally four races until each is ranked.
- If still tied, the decision will favor the yacht scoring the most points in the final race, or if still tied, the next previous race, etc. and finally four races, until each is ranked.

CLUB AWARD: This award is intended to encourage maximum participation by yachts from all clubs in all series events and to recognize the club with the most consistent overall participation and performance. Scoring for this trophy will be as follows:

- 1. All qualifying yachts (starting three of the four series events) will be counted. Points earned by each yacht in each race will be summed. The club with the highest number of points earned by all yachts from that club will win the series club championship award.
- In the event of a tie on total points, the club with the most individual qualifying yachts participating in the series will win the award.

### PUGET SOUND JACK & JILL CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES

### PERPETUAL CLUB TROPHY

There will be a perpetual trophy, hereinafter referred to as the "Club Trophy", provided by Seattle Yacht Club in recognition of the yacht club with highest series point total at the end of each year. This award is intended to encourage maximum participation by yachts from all clubs in all series events and to recognize the club with the most consistent overall participation and performance.

#### **SERIES RULES**

ELIGIBILITY: All series events are "Open" races. Any yacht with a current PHRF handicap and PIYA affiliated club membership may participate, subject to meeting each individual yacht club's entry requirements and payment of applicable entry fees. Yachts competing in this series are restricted to one male and one female crewmember.

PARTICIPATION: Participation in the series is automatic for any eligible yacht participating in any of the designated events currently sponsored by Seattle Yacht Club, Shilshole Bay Yacht Club, Sloop Tavern Yacht Club and Corinthian Yacht Club of Seattle. However, a yacht must start in three of the four events to qualify as a series participant and earn series points toward the Club Trophy.

YACHT CLUB DESIGNATION: In the event that a participating yacht belongs to more than one yacht club, the entrant must notify the sponsoring yacht club as specified in the Series Rules for the current year which club they are representing prior to the first race entered. A participant need not belong to a sponsoring yacht club to earn points toward the Club Award.

SERIES DIVISIONS: The following <u>Series Divisions</u>, based on a yacht's FS rating, are established <u>solely</u> for the purpose of determining PUGET SOUND JACK & JILL CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES awards. A yacht without a FS rating will be rated for purposes of series scoring as if they have a standard spinnaker. A yacht with an approved rating change during this series will be scored in the division that they would fall within for the first scries race entered. These divisions are only for series scoring and do not affect rating breaks established by each club for its own event. These rating breaks may be changed by the sponsoring yacht club in the future based on series participation experience factors.

Division 1 105 or lower Division 2 106 to 171 Division 3 172 or higher

SCORING FOR INDIVIDUAL RACES: A yacht's finishing position within each established division (either NFS or FS) in any series race will determine points (rounded to the nearest tenth) earned towards series awards and the Club Trophy. The scoring formula is as follows:

Points... =  $100 \times (N + 1 - FP) / (N + 1)$ Where... N = number of division start

N = number of division starters in each race and FP = a yacht's finish place within that division.

DNF =  $2/3 \times (N + 1)$ , DSQ =  $1/2 \times (N + 1)$  and DNS = 0

### SCORING FOR THE CLUB TROPHY:

- (1) All qualifying yachts (starting three of the four series events) will be counted. Points earned by each yacht in each of the four series events will be summed. The club with the highest number of points earned by all yachts from that club will win the Club Trophy.
- (2) In the event of a tie on total points, the club with the most individual qualifying yachts participating in the series will win the Club Trophy.

AWARD PRESENTATION: The sponsoring yacht club will present the Club Trophy at a suitable time and place following the last race of the series. The Club Trophy may be maintained by the winning yacht club until date of the last race at the end of the following year's series. At that time the Club Trophy will be returned to the sponsoring club for presentation to the current year's winner.

### DEED OF GIFT

#### JACK AND JILL OVERALL

#### TROPHY

The Trophy is intended to encourage and honor double-handed sailboat racing with one each male and female crew. Specifically, it intends recognition for the overall winner of the "JACK AND JILL CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES" sponsored by participating yacht clubs on Puget Sound.

The Trophy consists of matching brass dolphins on a teak base with brass name and winner engraving plates. It shall be the property of Shilshole Bay Yacht Club who shall administer its use in perpetuity. The overall winner of the series shall have their name, year and boat name engraved on the Trophy. The annual winner may be allowed to display the Trophy at their yacht club.

The duties of Shilshole Bay Yacht Club shall be:

- Encourage the "JACK AND JILL" type racing and continued use of the Trophy.
- 2. Maintain and engrave the Trophy.
- 3. Make decisions regarding the Trophy.
- 4. Make changes in the deed as necessary to fulfill the intent of the donors as future sailboat racing developes.
