





2022 Tasar World Championship

Notice of Race

1. Rules

- 1.1. The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined by *The Racing Rules of Sailing* and the rules of the World Tasar Class Association (www.tasar.org).
- 1.2. All competitors shall wear a life jacket or other adequate personal flotation device at all times while on the water other than brief periods while adding or removing clothing. This changes Rule 40.
- 1.3. All applicable rule changes will appear in full in the Sailing Instructions. The Sailing Instructions may also change other racing rules. Where there is a conflict, the Sailing Instructions will take precedence over the Notice of Race.
- 1.4. Decisions of the international jury will be final as provided in rule 70.5.
- 1.5. The organizing authority is Seattle Yacht Club.

2. Advertising & Bow Numbers

- 2.1. Advertising shall be in accordance with ISAF Regulation 20, Advertising Code.
- 2.2. Boats may be required to display advertising and bow numbers supplied by the organizing authority.

3. Eligibility & Entry

- 3.1. The regatta is open to all boats of the Tasar class.
- 3.2. Competitors must be members in good standing of their regional Tasar Class Association. Competitors who wish to become members of their regional TCA may join by completing their registration and making payment prior to the close of registration for the regatta.
- 3.3. Eligible competitors may enter by completing registration (when available) and fee payment on the event website <u>tasarworlds2022.org</u>. Registrations must be completed by 1700 on September 17, 2022.
- 3.4. Competitors will be required to agree to a waiver of liability as a condition of eligibility. This waiver may be completed either during online registration or at the event check-in.

4. Classification

4.1. This event is open to sailors of all classifications as described in the ISAF Regulation 22, ISAF Sailor Classification Code.

5. Entry Fees

- 5.1. The entry fee is \$800USD for entries completed with payment no later than July 11, 2022.
- 5.2. An entry fee of \$950USD will be charged for entries completed or paid after July 11, 2022.
- 5.3. Entries will not be accepted after 1700 on September 17, 2022.
- 5.4. Entry fees include moorage, regatta souvenir, post-racing refreshments, and admission to the scheduled social events.

^{*}Time for First Race Warning is subject to Race Committee discretion. Any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 2000 on the day before it will take effect.

6.1. A maximum of 3 races may be sailed each day. A maximum of 14 races are scheduled for the series.

7. Inspection & Measurement

- 7.1. All boats must comply with the Tasar Class Rules.
- 7.2. Boats may be inspected for safety equipment and measurement compliance at any time during the regatta.
- 7.3. It is the responsibility of each entrant to provide any supplementary weights necessary to ensure compliance with Tasar Class Rule C6. These must be presented at Measurement. The Race Committee may reject at its discretion any form of supplementary weight it considers unsuitable.
- 7.4. Random measurement and compliance checks may be made throughout the regatta at the discretion of the Race Committee.
- 7.5. For measurement breaches or protests the jury may impose discretionary penalties, which may be less than disqualification.

8. Sailing Instructions

8.1. The Sailing Instructions will be available during on-site check-in and prior to the event at <u>tasarworlds2022.org</u>.

9. Venue

9.1. Racing will be conducted on Puget Sound in the Shilshole Bay area and areas to the north of Meadow Point. The regatta location street address is 7755 Seaview Ave. NW, Seattle, WA 98117

10. Courses

10.1. The courses will be prescribed in the Sailing Instructions and will include windward, leeward, and reaching legs.

11. Scoring

- 11.1. The Low-Point Scoring System will be used. However, if fewer than 6 races are completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores; if from 6 to 11 races are completed, her series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score; and if 12 or more races are completed, her series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two worst scores.
- 11.2. A minimum of three races must be completed to constitute a regatta.

12. Berthing

12.1. All boats shall be kept in the assigned storage area near Corinthian Yacht Club.

13. Prizes

- 13.1. Prizes will be awarded to the top six positions overall.
- 13.2. Additional prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the organizing authority.

14. Safety

- 14.1. Boats shall not impede the passage of commercial vessels and shall comply with the <u>U.S. Inland Navigation</u>
 Rules Act of 1980. Boats that fail to comply promptly with signals from a committee boat to alter course, or that receive a 5-blast warning (5 short sounds) from a commercial vessel, will be subject to protest and possible disqualification.
- 14.2. All competitors' attention is drawn to <u>U.S. Federal Law § Title 33</u>, <u>Part 175</u>, <u>Subpart B Personal Floatation Devices</u> that may be enforced by local law enforcement agencies, which requires that each boat must carry for each competitor aboard either a US Coast Guard-approved flotation device or a flotation device conforming to the regulations of their own country. Failure by a competitor to heed this advice is not a protestable item.

15. Risk, Disclaimer of Liability & Personal Conduct

- 15.1. Competitors participate in the regatta at their own risk. See Rule 4 (Decision to Race). The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.
- 15.2. The competitor will accept full responsibility for all his/her actions during any activity related to the event. This includes on-shore activities before, during, and after the regatta.

16. Insurance

16.1. Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$500,000 per event or the equivalent. Competitors must be prepared to supply proof of insurance on request.


17. Right to Use Names & Likeness
